VERIFIED COMPLAINT

FLORIDA STATUTES CHAPTER 61 "DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE" ALIMONY
PROVISIONS IMPERMISSIBLY INFRINGE THE FEDERAL RIGHT TO PRIVACY

INTRODUCTORY STATEMENT

- 1) Now comes the Plaintiff, STEWART GREENBERG, who asserts, that Florida Statutes Chapter 61 "Dissolution of Marriage" alimony provisions (§ 61.08 et al)
 - a. impermissibly infringe the U.S. Constitution, Fourteenth Amendment Due Process Clause, Section 2, fundamental Federal Right to Privacy in the Privacy Protected Zone of "Personal Decisions Relating to Marriage";
