MEMBERS UPDATE

REPORT TO THE BOARD

We continue to press forward with our program of Alimony Reform. Our legal team has succeeded in having two of our declaratory judgment cases scheduled for oral arguments before the appellate courts. We also have two cases pending acceptance by the Florida Supreme Court.

Bill Cabana has appeared for oral argument in Tampa and will submit a detailed report of the hearing.

The 2007 session of the Florida legislature has ended with no Alimony Reform bill, however our legislative representative, Todd Parrish has met with several legislators and we have requested that the Senate judicial committee do a summer study program of the Alimony Scheme. All of you are encouraged to contact your local state representatives and ask that they support this summer study program and our program of Alimony reform which will align Florida with an Alimony law similar to Texas.

Guy Azar has prepared a sample DVD that can be distributed to all T.V. outlets in addition to the news media in general and all Florida Judges. The proposed subject matter is attached separately and you are invited to comment.

Our Orlando rally was well accepted by the media with two newspapers, two radio stations and Channel 6 interviewing us. This was despite the very small turn out. Only 8 people cared enough to participate despite our having approximately 150 members within 75 miles of Orlando.

It appears that we must expand our program to reach the general public, literally taking the Alimony Reform movement to the streets. Please give this your sincere consideration as to how we can reach the public with our message of Alimony Reform.

We may consider hiring a public relations firm to educate the masses about the "lifetime Alimony Scheme". However funding will be a primary concern. For some reason very few are willing to come forth with financial support for our program. We have accomplished much with a shoe string budget. What do we need to do to get more people involved----in many ways??

Regional chapters may be one way for us to increase our public exposure by conducting more demonstration rally's at the various Court houses and other places where the public gathers, even sporting events. Each of you is urged to consider forming such a chapter. We will assist you in any way possible.

Cathy Ortiz has formed a chapter in Massachusetts. She has already succeeded in having an Alimony Reform Bill introduced to the Massachusetts legislature. Also her group has filed a declatory judgment case challenging the constitutionality of the Massachusetts Alimony Scheme. Cathy is doing a great job and is a leader all of us can be proud of.

We continue to receive "CRIES FOR HELP" almost daily from victims of the Alimony Scheme. It is encouraging that almost one-half of these cries for help are from the ladies who recognize that what takes place in Divorce Court is not the "American Way". For some reason those that need help are not willing to take an active part in our program, even after we go to bat for them.

Our constitutional amendment petition to put Alimony Reform before the voters is not receiving the required signatures of Florida registered voters. Over 400,000 are needed and without serious funding to pay for paid workers it does not appear that this constitutional amendment will reach the voters.

We continue our dedication to Alimony Reform. We must and will move forward. But we need the help of everyone that recognizes the Alimony Scheme is not right. Remember, together we will succeed. Thanks to all of you for your help.
